COMPOST RECIPES

Trash Bin Compacter

- 1 shovel mulch, wood chips/straw
- 3 parts brown leaves
- 1 part vegetable scraps

African Keyhole

- 6 parts straw/shredded leaves
- 1 part manure
- 1 part food scraps
- 1 part green plant trimmings

Sheet Composting (Alternate layers, starting with paper)

- 1 part black & white newspaper/cardboard
- 3 parts brown leaves
- 2 parts straw
- 1 part manure
- · 1 part food scraps
- 1 part yard trimmings
- 1 part finished compost

Hot Composting (Freeze kitchen scraps from 1 month

- 6 parts dry shredded leaves
- 3 parts shredded newspaper/straw/cardboard
- 1 part manure or coffee grounds
- 1 part grass or plant trimmings
- · 1 part food scraps
- 1 part good finished compost
